Fun & FootGolf Requirements

Space:

- 9 Hole Fun & FootGolf Course between 12,500 m² and 15,000 m²
- 18 Hole Fun & FootGolf Course 22,500 m² and 30,000 m²

Terrain:

Preferably flat though some sloping beneficial for natural features

Ground Conditions:

- Free draining
- Preferably sand based

Weather Conditions:

- All
- Top-dressed synthetic all-weather materials used

Preferred Locations:

Standalone:

- Populated areas with diverse demographic
- Good local footfall i.e. city location, tourist location or nearby to shopping centre/mall
- Road-side frontage
- Incorporated within an existing leisure environment

For Resort Locations:

- Near clubhouse / resort hub





The steps to implement a 9-Hole FootGolf course are as follows:

Phase 1 - Requirements - 2 to 4 weeks

- 1. Site survey
- 2. Define available space
- 3. Draft design and plans
- 4. Finalise costs
- 5. Define Scope of Work (SOW)
- 6. Sign contracts

Phase 2 - Preparation - 2 to 3 weeks

- 7. IGD provide project plan and schedule
- 8. Customer ensures clear access to site
- 9. Customer ensures water & electricity available
- 10. Customer confirms appropriate planning permissions in place
- 11. Site cleared
- 12. Materials shipped to site
- 13. Locally sourced materials ordered (i.e. stone, sand, bark, sleepers if applicable)
- 14. Machinery ordered
- 15. Security fencing erected (if required) along with lockable storage and temporary toilet facilities
- 16. Travel arrangements confirmed and booked for install team

Phase 3 – Construction & Shaping – 2 to 3 weeks

- 17. Install team arrive on-site
- 18. Site surveyed and clearance checked
- 19. Mark out course
- 20. Mark out boundary
- 21. Shape the holes timeline dependent on natural topography and amount of earth required for shaping
- 22. Ensure cabling laid for lighting if applicable local electrician(s) required for this to meet local legislation
- 23. Lay drainage if required
- 24. Pathways defined from hole-to-hole
- 25. Ditches for water features and bunkers prepared

Phase 4 – Laying the Tees and Greens – 2 to 3 weeks

- 26. Layer 1 crushed concrete
- 27. Layer 2 Type One concrete laid
- 28. Layer 3 5mm to dust laid (or equivalent)
- 29. Wet and compact the aggregate





- 30. Lay turf greens, fringes and tees
- 31. Install FootGolf cups
- 32. Infill turf with sand ca 0.5 tonnes per hole

Phase 5 – Landscaping and Features – 1 week

- 33. Bunkering prepared and filled with sand
- 34. Landscaping, planting of trees and vegetation
- 35. Fencing erected
- 36. Addition of further features where applicable (i.e. ponds, lakes, brooks)

Phase 6 – Preparing to Open – 2 weeks

- 37. Flags/pins ordered ready for opening
- 38. Signage ordered
 - o 9 tee signs
 - Signage from greens to tees
 - o Pricing, rules and terms and conditions signage produced
- 39. Size 5 footballs ordered for FootGolf IGD recommends ca. 50 balls
- 40. FunGolf SNAG equipment ordered
- 41. Scorecards ordered
- 42. Ensure appropriate cashiering and reception facilities in place
